Newton, MA--A conference entitled "Citizenship-in-Question" will take place at Boston College Law School on Thursday April 19, at 5:30 pm in East Wing room 120.

BC Law Dean Vincent Rougeau will give the opening remarks at the conference, where an international panel of scholars in legal and political thought on citizenship claims will discuss the issue of citizenship and its interpretation across the globe.
